Number

We have been working on counting forwards and backwards to 20. We have also been exploring pictorial addition. Use objects in your house to add together. Encourage your child to use language such as add, plus, equals, how many altogether?

Literacy

We are revising our letters and sounds. Please also practice the formation of the letters. Please continue to learn words in word books every night. The children are beginning to write sentences independently using their key words.

New life

Take your child on a nature walk to a park or woods or work in your own garden. Discuss seasonal changes. Look at new buds on the trees and watch new leaves appearing. Notice new flowers growing. Name common flowers such as the snowdrop or daffodil.

Animals

Talk about and observe the changes in animals during spring. Discuss how animals such as frogs, hedgehogs etc have woken from their winter hibernation. Talk about how birds make nests and have their young. Discuss food that comes from the farm and what animals produce the food. E.g. milk from cows, sausages from pigs, eggs from hens. Discuss the job of the farmer, i.e. milks the cows, ploughs the fields, feeds the animals, helps make animals better etc.
